Twenty years ago this spring, residential recycling and the household hazardous waste programs started throughout Kalamazoo County. To date, households recycled over 330 million pounds of papers and containers and diverted four million pounds of household chemicals from landfills. The Kalamazoo County Household Hazardous Waste Center offers a free drop-off to properly dispose of pesticides, car batteries and fluids (such as pure used motor oil, antifreeze, brake fluid, etc.), mercury, fluorescent lights, household batteries, and limited amounts of computers and televisions. The Center is located at 1301 Lamont Avenue, at the edge of the County Fairgrounds.
